Warsaw Community High School offers a diverse and robust curriculum with many opportunities for AP and dual credit courses in conjunction with neighboring colleges and universities. WCHS currently offers 17 AP courses in English, mathematics, science, social studies, computer programming and world languages.

Forty-one AP and dual college credit classes are offered each year in English, math, world language, social studies, technology and art. Dual credit offerings in conjunction with Warsaw Area Career Center number 56 courses with more being added each year.

### **OUR COMMUNITY**

WCHS and the WACC are located in the northern Indiana city of Warsaw. Warsaw and the surrounding local communities are known for its abundance of lakes, streams and recreational activities. Forbes Magazine ranked the community No. 11 among the top 15 "Best Small Cities to Raise a family."

The community has a storied history as a national and global industry leader. For over 120 years, Warsaw has been known as the Orthopedic Manufacturing Capital of the World. Today, over 50 percent of the world market share for orthopedic devices come from Warsaw-based companies.

In addition, the community is home to the largest soy diesel plant in North America, the world's largest manufacturer of projector screens, and some of the largest global printing presses.

Warsaw is also surrounded by one of the largest agricultural economies in the Midwest. These incorporate the agricultural sciences of crop production, world-leading duck producers and alternative energy producers. WCHS has a strong network of higher education institutions within a short distance including Notre Dame, Ball State, Grace College, Ivy Tech, Purdue, Indiana University and more.

### GRADING STUDENT WORK

Classes of 2018 and 2019 are on a 12.0 scale with 3 pts. per semester added as weighted grades for honors courses ending in 2017. Beginning with the Class of 2020, students are on a 4.0 scale with no weighted grades to ensure the integrity of grades and academic achievement. Classes receive one credit per semester. Rank in class is determined based on all classes taken. All members of the class on a diploma track are included in the ranking and GPA calculations. GPA and rank are calculated at the end of each semester.



#### Did You Know....

On average, WCHS SAT test takers scored 551 on the EBRW and 546 on the mathematics section of the test. ACT test takers averaged 23.8 composite, 23.8 English, 24.4 mathematics, 24.2 reading, 22.9 science and 13.3 writing.

# WCHS GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate from Warsaw Community High School, a student must attend a minimum of six semesters and earn at least 40 credits as required by the state of Indiana diploma minimum credit total. One credit represents the work completed in one course for the semester.

In addition to the credits listed above, students who complete a minimum of 47 credits in specified courses and maintain at least 3.0 average GPA may also earn Indiana's Academic Honors Diploma - an award noted on diplomas. Forty-seven percent of graduating students in the class of 2017 received an academic honors diploma.

### **DUAL CREDIT**

With the number of dual credit (meaning your student earns college credit and high school credit), Advanced Placement (AP) and certification programs available at Warsaw Community High School and Warsaw Area Career Center your student can leave prepared to be successful in college or go right into the workforce at a higher level than others competing for the same positions. Many students have at least a semester's worth of college credits when they leave high school.
